Dear Parents and Carers

Once again, I must inform you of more planned teacher strikes this week and next. There is planned action for Thursday, 27 April and Tuesday, 2 May. Again, this will cause significant disruption to the school, meaning we will not be able to teach all students on those days.

Therefore, please read the following information carefully, as the set up this week is different to the last strike.

On Thursday, 27 April 2023 and Tuesday, 2 May, only the following student groups will be required to attend school:

1. Vulnerable students (you will be contacted directly by the school)
2. All 11 students
3. Some Y13 students
4. Some other Y10 and 12 student groups (dependent on teacher availability. Students will be informed directly by their classroom teacher).

Year 11 students:

All Y11 students will start their day as normal at 8.25am. Changes to their timetable will be shared with them during their tutor time period. It is important that you attend, teachers will be in school to help prepare you for your upcoming GCSEs.

Year 13 students:

Y13 students that have a timetabled lesson period 1, will attend as normal. Other Y13 students will be advised about their lessons running or not, via email. It is important that you attend, teachers will be in school to help prepare you for your upcoming A-Levels.

Some Y10 and Y12 students

In some cases, we have enough teaching staff to take a small number of classes. The teacher of the class will inform them of the need to attend, directly.

Students in Y7, 8 & 9 and the majority of Y10 and Y12, will be able to access learning online via the following programme of study for that day:

- Students will have access to a range of resources to support them with their remote learning during the strike day. Remote learning will be set on Arbor for English, Maths, Science, History and Geography. This will involve accessing online lessons via Oak Academy, assignments on GCSEPod or Hegarty Maths. All students have been prepared in their lessons with their login details to be able to access this learning.
- Work booklets can be provided as an alternative. Please inform the Pastoral Officer for your child, if you require this resource.



- Further help and guidance is available via the school's website on how to access remote learning [HERE](#). If your child does not have access to an IT device or internet access, please get in touch with the school by the end of the week and we will support you as best we can.

There will be no enrichment activities on either day, meaning that the school day will finish at 2.35pm for all students in attendance.

Twilight lessons, for Post 16 students, where we can staff them, will run as normal. Details will be shared on the day with students.

As previously, please note, because of the uncertainty over who will be striking, and the effect to teachers with children in other schools may have, in terms of childcare arrangements, we may have to change our plans entirely, either the day before or indeed even on the day itself.


We will do all we can to maintain, as 'normal' a curriculum as we can, but, if this is not possible, I may have to send some students home on the day itself or close the school entirely.

In whichever case presents itself, I will ensure we communicate any changes to you as quickly as possible.

Any families who are entitled to free school meals, can request grab bags for both days. These will be provided on Wednesday, 26 April or by collection on Tuesday, 2 May. Please inform your child's Pastoral Officer if you wish to take up this offer.
